Purpose

1. The quarterly report for 1 July to 30 September 2022 from Education New Zealand Manapou ki te Ao (ENZ) is attached for your information.

Background

2. The quarterly report provides an overview of ENZ's first quarter performance for 2022/23. This quarterly report reflects the development and implementation of ENZ's strategic four-year plan and aligns with the *New Zealand International Education Strategy 2022-2030* (NZIES).
3. ENZ's performance is assessed against ENZ's *Statement of Intent 2022-2026*, *Statement of Performance Expectations 2022/23*, ENZ's Business Plan 2022/23 and your Letter of Expectations. Performance is reported against the following strategic objectives:
 - **Tono/invitation:** Aotearoa New Zealand's unique education offerings and services are highly sought after by international learners
 - **Pono/integrity:** Aotearoa New Zealand delivers high-quality and diverse education experiences that are sustainable, globally competitive and deliver value to all involved
 - **Hono/global connections:** Aotearoa New Zealand makes the best possible use of its international education expertise to improve educational outcomes, establish partnerships and grow global connections
 - **Kono/nourishers:** ENZ's core capabilities nourish the organisation and support the delivery of all Strategic Objectives under the Four-year plan.
4. ENZ's areas of focus and performance for this first quarter has been on:
 - understanding and rebuilding sector capability through sustained engagement with the sector
 - mobilising the sector to access key markets through strategic in-market engagement and agreements
 - rekindling brand awareness of New Zealand through our global marketing and PR initiatives
 - supporting student experience including ensuring new and returning international students arriving in New Zealand are warmly welcomed
 - working closely with other agencies on planning for your travel to Asia in October to ensure the trip delivers opportunities to demonstrate that New Zealand is 'open for business'.
5. The report has been provided to ENZ's monitoring agencies (Ministry of Education and Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment) for their review. They will provide independent advice about ENZ's performance to you in their monitoring role.
6. ENZ's Board reviewed the quarterly report ahead of its interim Board meeting on 17 November and approved providing the report to you.
