Dear Withheld under s9(2)(a) of the Official Information Act

I refer to your official information request, received by Education New Zealand (ENZ) on 1 March 2019. This response relates to your request, as follows:

I request a copy of all correspondence and communications from 13 February 2019 to 20 February 2019 concerning international perceptions of the announced vocational education reforms, especially in China.

The following table summarises our decision on the release of the documents within the scope of your request that are held by ENZ. Unless publicly available, the phone numbers of individuals have been withheld from all documents under so(2)(a) to protect the privacy of natural persons.

Please note that references to an "urgent request from the Minister" in some emails from Annabel Robertson are in error, and were the result of a misunderstanding of internal ENZ communications. For clarity, the Minister of Education did not direct (urgently or otherwise) ENZ to seek the views of international education providers on the Review of Vocational Education proposal announced on 13 February 2019.



They were particularly interested in what one merged institution would "look" like, and suggested that next time he's in the States the Minister visit the Florida College System, which they thought may be a similar model to what is being proposed (I haven't really looked into this yet, but after a quick glance at the website it seems the 28 community colleges of the Florida College System are locally governed but administrated centrally).

I'll let you know whether I hear anything more - I am speaking at the IIE Summit next week and it's possible something will come up then (but that's after the meeting with the Minister!). formation



As per our chat just now, the general take on things is that it is too early to tell. News has not gone to international markets and back to providers/us yet. Also everyone is aware that the devil is in the detail and that is still to come.

John Mollo is talking to G2G about co-developing messaging for overseas institutional partners. They anticipate concerns here and John is trying to get these captured and sent through by COB today.

However, we have had some feedback from a small handful of providers

ITPs:

- Too early for conversations with agents
- 50:50 positive/negative with a lot of questions
- Positive move for those providers that have been bailed out under current model (some of them a number of times)
- Some agents will be wary of centralisation of admissions and enrolments
- Expecting at least two years of lower levels of international student enrolments before brand awareness of
 potential new providen is gained and admissions/enrolments are operating well
- Very concerned about agents being given as positive a message as possible. Request for strengthened messaging around, particularly for agents:
 - · Students will still receive quality tuition
 - Student support services are still in place
 - You can still enrol students

- Aware of opportunities for PTEs in the proposal, but also aware of the risks.
- Onshore agents starting to lose confidence
- Questions being asked by ITENZ of their members:
 - What programmes will you be delivering? Will they/should they be approved and/or developed by the new Industry Skills Body and is that OK? if not why not?
 - Could you be involved in managing a work based training contract, if this is to be removed from the existing ITO function? PTEs are certainly considered in the proposal as providers this means that the Government is consulting on whether workplace training should be delivered through PTEs, wananga and

the New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology.

- If the funding decisions are driven by the ISBs is that going to be a risk to your PTE? i.e. If the ISB decides there should be a certain amount of funding for hospitality and one of their functions is advising the TEC on what to purchase, could this impact on you?
- If there are changes to the funding system to help enable the changes proposed for provider roles and the creation of a New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology, what would you like to see?

Vocationa reforms could damage international student market

The Government is urgently seeking advice about negative international perceptions since announcing wide ranging vocational education reforms last week, National's Tertiary Education, Skills and Employment Spokesperson Shane Reti says.

The Minister has not directed ENZ to seek the views of any providers or others about the international implications of RoVE or other policies. There is a formal consultation process, underway, led by MOE, to gather the views of all parties.

As part of its normal intelligence gathering, ENZ is always talking to education providers about their needs, perspectives and issues.

There were two strands of intelligence that have come together here.

In response to the current focus and media coverage on the China relationship, ENZ was taking the pulse of key providers about early indications of China enrolments this year. It will be some months before official enrolment data is in, and we wanted to get an assessment of how the year has started. (That showed a mixed picture, with universities, in particularly, generally seeing strong enrolments)

Earlier, our Industry team was, as it common v does, gauging some initial reactions to the RoVE proposals. Specifically, we had internally asked the team for "any early indications regarding of how the Review of Vocational Education (RoVE) is being seen in our international markets. If you hear or see anything, can you let me know by Tuesday morning (NZ time) covering:

- What have been the main gueries?
- Are there questions about whether they should still be recruiting internationally?
- What about existing partnerships/contracts?
- Have any markets or regions raised specific concerns or issues?"

We wanted to ensure we were in a position to understand the questions providers might have about international implications. We also wanted to be able to give the Minister an initial readout at our normal scheduled meeting with him.

The email you have referred to, went to ENZ's PTE reference group -- a group of international managers in PTEs who ENZ talks to frequently.

Feedback from Amy Rutherford, International (USA) (15 February)

I haven't seen anything in US media, but I did have a meeting with representatives from the Department of State Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs yesterday who were interested in the Review, and potential outcomes from it.

They were particularly interested in what one merged institution would "look" like, and suggested that next time he's in the States the Minister visit the Florida College System, which they thought may be a similar model to what is being proposed (I haven't really looked into this yet, but after a quick glance at the website it seems the 28 community colleges of the Florida College System are locally governed but administrated centrally). I'll let you know whether I hear anything more – I am speaking at the IIE Summit next week and it's possible something will come up then (but that's after the meeting with the Minister!).

Feedback from Ana Azevedo, International (Brazil) (15 February)

So far I haven't received any enquiries but I write again before the meeting [No further feedback received]

Feedback from Javiera Visedo, International (Chile and Colombia) (19 February)

I haven't received any inquires however we have 2 scholarships schemes with the Chilean government that have an ITP as partner so it would be great to know what kind of updates we will be providing them in a near future.

- Tecnicos para Chile (Ministry of Education) (Agreement with Wintec and OP
- Semillero Rural (Ministry of Agriculture): Agreement with OP

Last October we also had a delegation of Chilean ITPs and PTEs that were interested in establishing partnerships with NZ ITPs. I haven't chase this too much as I knew changes were coming (we also gave them heads up on this). No much activity/ inquiries from Colombia.

February is still a holiday month in Chile so no much activity. March could be busier, we also have a new Ambassador arriving tomorrow to Chile. It would be great to know what kind of information has been sent to Posts by MFAT on this theme, in case they are asked about these changes.

Feedback from Margaret Low, International (Malaysia) (19 February)

I only heard from an ENZRA. His concern is whether they should continue recruiting international students for next year. Anyway, I just saw Jo Keane's email to the ENZRAs regarding the review and that should answer his question.

Industry Development team

Feedback from Andy Walker, Industry Development (15 February)

The general chat around is actually far more positive than I expected. I was heartened by the changes that were made to the consultation document and fact sheets. They were far more positive and future focussed than the drafts, and I am sure this has helped. Very brief comments below which I will update if I hear anything more. The ID team sent specific emails to our Managed Customers yesterday so still early days.

Feedback via Jo (18 February)

As per our chat just now, the general take on things is that it is too early to tell. News has not gone to international markets and back to providers/us yet. Also everyone is aware that the devil is in the detail and that is still to come. John Mollo is talking to G2G about co-developing messaging for overseas institutional partners. They anticipate concerns here and John is trying to get these captured and sent through by COB today. However, we have had some feedback from a small handful of providers ITPs:

• Too early for conversations with agents

50:50 positive/negative with a lot of questions

- Positive move for those providers that have been bailed out under current model (some of them a number of times)
- Some agents will be wary of centralisation of admissions and enrolments
- Expecting at least two years of lower levels of international student enrolments before brand awareness of potential new provider is gained and admissions/enrolments are operating well
- Very concerned about agents being given as positive a message as possible. Request for strengthened messaging around, particularly for agents: 1982
 - Students will still receive quality tuition
 - Student support services are still in place
 - You can still enrol students
 - Students can still finish their courses and receive their qualification

PTEs

- Aware of opportunities for PTEs in the proposal, but also aware of the risks.
- Onshore agents starting to lose confidence
- Questions being asked by ITENZ of their members:
 - What programmes will you be delivering? Will they/should they be approved and/or developed by the new Industry Skills Body and is that OK? if not why not?
 - Could you be involved in managing a work based training contract, if this is to be removed from the existing ITO function? PTEs are certainly considered in the proposal as providers, this means that the Government is consulting on whether workplace training should be delivered through PTEs, wananga and the New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology.
 - If the funding decisions are driven by the ISBs is that going to be a tsk to your PTE? i.e. If the ISB decides there should be a certain amount of funding for hospitality and one of their functions is advising the TEC on what to purchase, could this impact on you?
 - If there are changes to the funding system to help enable the changes proposed for provider roles and the creation of a New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology, what would you like to see?

- Ŷ Recently, Ara Institute of Canterbury's ground-breaking new Master of Sustainable Practice has been approved and is accepting applications for 2019 enrollment. Students in the program will work collaboratively and across disciplines to solve real world environmental, social and technological challenges.

 m Y}$ The program is unique in Australasia and is modelled after the Arizona State

University's School of Sustainability programs. Ara is also introducing a graduate Certificate of Sustainable Practice and a Diploma of Sustainable Practice that can lead to the Master qualification.

Ÿ Students from other countries have already expressed interest and overseas applications will be taken for 2020 onward. As a multidisciplinary program, the Master program will be taught by research staff from sustainability, business, engineering, architectural studies, midwifery and international tourism and hospitality.

Major changes for Polytechnics proposed by Government who is proposing all sixteen Polytechnics be merged into one 'entity' chinanews.com, 2019.2.13

- Ÿ On February 13th, New Zealand Education Minister Chris Hipkins released wide ranging proposals that all sixteen Polytechnics be merged into one 'entity' called the New Zealand Institute of Skills & Technology for strengthening vocational education so that school dropouts are provided with high quality training opportunities. This will grow a skilled workforce to meet employers' needs and New Zealanders will be better equipped for the changing nature of work.
- Chris Hipskin said that the development of courses and programmes would be consolidated, improving consistency and freeing up resources to expand front-line delivery. There will be more sharing of expertise and best-practice, and more use of online, distance, and blended learning.
- Ÿ Chris Hipskin also expressed that the government cannot continue to tweak the system knowing that the model is fundamentally broken, and isn't delivering NZ workforce the skills that they need to thrive. However, the Government won't make any decisions until they have heard and carefully considered feedback from this consultation process

[AU] Australia may become the 2nd popular destination for international students with six consecutive years of growth in its education industry

- Y Australian Bureau of Statistics recently released new statistics that the Australia economic impact of the industry registered a sixth consecutive year of growth in 2018. Australia is closing in on overtaking the UK in at least one measure of international education and the value of Australia's education exports improved 15% to reach \$34.9bn during 2018.

Y Australia Education minister Dan Tehan said Australia has established a global reputation as a leader in higher education, and the British-based Centre for Global Higher Education predicted Australia will leapfrog the UK to become the world's second most popular destination for international students this year.

Ÿ However, Chief executive of IEAA, Phil Honeywood, warned against using the latest economic data as an indicator of the success of the industry. He said traditional indicators such as English language and foundation courses had seen subdued enrolments and could be an indicator of an overall decrease soon.

[US] The DHS set up a sting operation again and hundreds of students are detained chinanews.com, 2019.2.1

 Recently, according to federal prosecutors, eight defendants associated with University of Farmington were accused of visa fraud conspiracy and harboring aliens for profit. The University of Farmington is a fake university used by Homeland Security agents to arrest recruiters who helped foreign nationals illegally remain and work in the US.

- \ddot{Y} The U.S. Department of Homeland Security set up the University of Farmington in 2015 to target foreign students who stayed in the country past their visas or looked to re-enter the country. The indictment said the university was being used by foreign citizens as a 'pay to stay' scheme which allowed these individuals to stay in the U.S.
- \ddot{Y} It is the second time that the ICE set up a sting operation. In 2016, they established the University of Northern New Jersey, where they ended up arresting 21 people who were acting as the recruiters. Among thousands of affected students, there were a large number of Chinese students.

[US] Asian students in specialized high schools would plummet under proposed admissions changes

- Ÿ The number of Asian kids admitted to the city's specialized high schools would plummet by roughly half under City Hall's proposed admissions revamp according to a new report.
- Ÿ To enroll more black and Hispanic students at the largely Asian and white schools, Schools Chancellor Richard Carranza hope to abolish the current single-test admissions structure and instead admit kids who finish in the top 7 percent of every middle school in the city.
- \ddot{Y} After the implementation of the new admissions scheme, the enrollment rate of groups of African-Americans, Hispanics, females, and poor students will be increased; while Asians would get 31 percent of offers under the proposal compared to the 61 percent who enrolled as freshmen for the 2017-2018 school year.
- Supporters of the status quo counter that it rewards raw diligence and preparation and defends against opaque admissions practices. Meanwhile, they thought that Asian students would still comprise the highest percentage of specialized-highschool enrollees.

 X According to a survey from the Council of Graduate Schools, new enrollments of international students at U.S. graduate schools fell for the second year in a row. First-time international enrollments fell by 1 percent from fall 2017 to fall 2018, following a 1 percent decline from the year before.

The total number of applications submitted by prospective international graduate students fell by 4 percent from the Fall 2017 to Fall 2018 semester. The number of international students enrolled in engineering programs—the most popular field for international students—declined by 10 percent.

Ÿ Suzanne Ortega, president of CGS, said that it is the first time there had been declines across two consecutive years and changes in immigration and visa policy could be one of the reasons. The Committee was concerned that it would jeopardize the U.S.'s image as a welcoming destination for international students and scholars.

ENZ has identified that a the proposed reform could result in a more coordinated, unified system which would maximise opportunities for New Zealand to deliver vocational education services to students from other countries. The greater national coordination possible under the proposal would allow the vocational education sector to market itself internationally under a consistent New Zealand brand, and cater for agreed regional priorities, needs and opportunities

The wording has been carefully chosen to align with ENZ and the Minister's messaging but please let me know if you have any feedback or questions.

Education Minister Chris Hipkins yesterday announced a major proposal to reform vocational education and training (VET) in New Zealand. This is known as the Reform of Vocational Education (RoVE).

The purpose of the proposed reform is to enable a stronger, unified, sustainable vocational education system that delivers the skills that learners, employers and communities need to be successful.

The proposed reform would bring together New Zealand's ITPs to create one new Institute of Skills and Technology, which would continue to be state-owned and funded. This is significant news for New Zealand's international education industry and is likely to have an impact on all sectors.

Vocational education continues to be very important to New Zealand. Education New Zealand (ENZ) will engage closely with the Ministry of Education and Tertiary Education Commissions while consultation is happening, decisions are being made, and implementation is rolled out.

While the RoVE is underway, ENZ will continue to work with ITPs at both an individual and a sector level to grow international education value. At a regional level, we will continue to support ITPs via our

Regional Partnership Programme.

Can't say how the review will impaction our marketing and recruitment in the next year, agents haven't said anything to me about it. When I get face-to-face between March and April on a 6 week trip I'll know more. I will be painting it as only a proposal, with little detail yet a baby 2 years of BAU (brand but potentially a great opportunity! Some agents will be wary of centralisation of admissions and enrolments, especially meaning they no longer get great 24 hour turnaround on applications... it is a worry and despite all best efforts I predict there will be two years of lower intl student enrolments to the sector as a whole, before brand awareness is gained and admissions/enrolments are operating well. Of course, this information will not be shared outside of ENZ - I should have mentioned that.




