Dear Withheld under s9(2)(a) of the Official Information Act

I refer to your official information request received by Education New Zealand (ENZ) on 28 February 2019. Following your agreement, the request was amended to:

A copy of all correspondence and communications to and from Annabel Robertson, Business Development Manager from 13 February 2019 relating to the Review of Vocational Education (RoVE) proposal.

The table below summarises our decisions on the release of the documents within the scope of your request. Unless publicly available, the phone numbers of individuals have been withheld from all documents under s9(2)(a) of the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) to protect the privacy of natural persons.

Please note that references to an "urgent request from the Minister" is some emails from Annabel Robertson are in error, and were the result of a misunderstanding of internal ENZ communications. For clarity, the Minister of Education did not direct (urgently or otherwise) ENZ to seek the views of international education providers on the Review of Vocational Education proposal announced on 13 February 2019.



Education Minister Chris Hipkins has announced a major proposal to reform vocational education and training (VET) in New Zealand. This is known as the Review of Vocations Education (RoVE).

A key aim is to create a more sustainable future for the Institute of Technology and Polytechnic (ITP) sector. Consultation on the proposed reform closes on 27 yerch 2019.

The proposed reform would bring together New Zealing's ITPs to create one new Institute of Skills and Technology, which would continue to be state-owned and funded.

This is significant news for our entire sector. Some 18,000 international students study at New Zealand's ITPs each year. These proposals will generate discussion and questions from stakeholders.

What are your roughts about the Reform of Vocational Education for your PTE?

Following the mouncements this week of the Reform of Vocational Education (ROVE mought it may be useful to give you a few pointers to consider for your PTE in light of this consultation and what you need to feedback on.

Of course, I'd also encourage you again to read the full consultation material at https://conversation.education.govt.nz/conversations/reform-of-vocational-education/have-your-say/.

It is true that there is no short term change for the PTE sector as there is no change for anyone at this stage, but if these changes to take place we do need

to consider what does it mean for you.

Some of the matters you could consider are:

- What programmes will you be delivering? Will they/should they be approved and/or developed by the new Industry Skills Body and is that OK? if not why not?
- Could you be involved in managing a work based training contact, if this
 is to be removed from the existing ITO function? PTEs are certainly
 considered in the proposal as providers this means that the
 Government is consulting on whether workplace training should be
 delivered through PTEs, wananga and the New Zealand Institute of
 Skills and Technology.
- If the funding decisions are only in by the ISBs is that going to be a risk
 to your PTE? i.e. If the ISB decides there should be a certain amount of
 funding for hospitality and one of their functions is advising the TEC on
 what to purchase could this impact on you?
- If the are changes to the funding system to help enable the changes proposed for provider roles and the creation of a New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology, what would you like to see?

This consultative process will, among other things, be looking at who should be responsible for what areas of decision making in our vocational sector.

There are opportunities for PTEs in this proposal, but we also need to be aware of the risks.

There are already 55 events planned over the next few weeks and we will hear more about opportunities for our sector next week, and how you can get involved (beyond sending a submission).

Some of you may remember Belinda Birchall (was McArtney) at TEC and she is now working solely on this project and is very happy to talk to any of you that want further clarification of the proposals and possible impact on PTEs.



Education Minister Chris Hipkins yesterday announced a major proposal to reform vocational education and training (VET) in New Zealand. This is known as the Reform of Vocational Education (RoVE).

The purpose of the proposed reform is to enable a stronger, unified, sustainable vocational education system that delivers the skills that learners, employers and communities need to be successful.

The proposed reform would bring together New Zealand's ITPs to create one new Institute of Skills and Technology, which would continue to be state-owned and funded. This is significant news for New Zealand's international education industry and is likely to have an impact on all sectors.

Vocational education continues to be very important to New Zealand. Education New Zealand (ENZ) will engage closely with the Ministry of Education and Tertiary Education Commissions while consultation is happening, decisions are being made, and implementation is rolled out.

While the RoVE is underway, ENZ will continue to work with ITPs at both an individual and a sector level to grow international education value. At a regional level, we will continue to support ITPs via our Regional Partnership Programme.



As per our chat just now, the general take on things is that it is too early to tell. News has not gone to international markets and back to providers/us yet. Also everyone is aware that the devil is in the detail and that is still to come.

John Mollo is talking to G2G about co-developing messaging for overseas institutional partners. They anticipate concerns here and John is trying to get these captured and sent through by COB today.

However, we have had some feedback from a small handful of providers

ITPs:

- Too early for conversations with agents
- 50:50 positive/negative with a lot of questions
- Positive move for those providers that have been bailed out under current model (some of them a number of times)
- Some agents will be wary of centralisation of admissions and enrolments
- Expecting at least two years of lower levels of international student enrolments before brand awareness of
 potential new provider is gained and admissions/enrolments are operating well
- Very concerned about agents being given as positive a message as possible. Request for strengthened messaging around, particularly for agents:
 - Students will there ive quality tuition
 - Student support services are still in place
 - You can still enrol students
 - Students can still finish their courses and receive their qualification

- Aware of opportunities for PTEs in the proposal, but also aware of the risks.
- Onshore agents starting to lose confidence
- Questions being asked by ITENZ of their members:
 - What programmes will you be delivering? Will they/should they be approved and/or developed by the new Industry Skills Body and is that OK? if not why not?
 - Could you be involved in managing a work based training contract, if this is to be removed from the existing ITO function? PTEs are certainly considered in the proposal as providers this means that the Government is consulting on whether workplace training should be delivered through PTEs, wananga and the New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology.

- > If the funding decisions are driven by the ISBs is that going to be a risk to your PTE? i.e. If the ISB decides there should be a certain amount of funding for hospitality and one of their functions is advising the TEC on what to purchase, could this impact on you?
- > If there are changes to the funding system to help enable the changes proposed for provider roles and the creation of a New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology, what would you like to see?







New Zealand (11th) is a global leader with respect to the Enable (5th) and Attract (4th) pillars. Its ability to attract both foreign and domestic talent is strong (ranking 7th in both External Openness and Internal Openness), while it performs particularly well in the Enable sub-pillars related to Regulatory Landscape (2nd) and Business and Labour Landscape (6th). Although the country is ranked 1st in the Engle of doing business indicator, there is room for improvement in other variables of the Market Landscape (2nd) sub-pillar, such as Competition intensity and Cluster development (both 42nd). The pillar that is holding lock New Zealand's overall rank the most is Vocational and Technical Skills (20th), where a relatively weak pool of Mid-Level Skills (41st) suggests the need for additional efforts to raise secondary education and improve vocational and technical training.







TEC indicated that RLGs are envisaged to be voluntary groups. ITPs feel that RLGs will not be comprised of the right voices or level of expertise if they are voluntary. TEC discussed how it is likely to need to be a different model in each region.
 - suggested that the EDAs would be the logical lead in many cases and that ENZ already has an international education partnership with EDAs under the RPP. TEC talked about bringing Regional Employment Hubs together with the RLGs although the regions have not yet been defined.

- 9. PTEs. highlighted how there is not a lot of information regarding PTEs. TEC expressed that PTEs are not impacted by any structural changes but that they will be part of delivery changes. PTEs could potentially deliver at ITP locations (as already poppens in some regions).
- 10. Concern from the that Immigration is in the tent on the proposals. Under current visa settings international students cannot take up apprenticeships or move from campus to campus. Belinda confirmed that MoE continues to consult with MBIE and INZ during the review process.
- 11. NZQA involvement TEC confirmed that NZQA are looking at international recognition in light of RoVE. NZQA engagement being made easier with Grant Klinkum in the joint MoE/TEC CE role.
- 12. Auckland ITP campuses. TEC doesn't know what the plan is for these as it has not yet been decided.
- 13. Contradiction between the Minister publicly saying that the system is broken but also wanting to reassure international markets. The letter from the Minister will help with this issue. I provided an update on the communications plan and outputs from ENZ but I made the point of clarifying that ENZ is not part of the official consultation feedback process.
- 14. ITPs are expecting a drop in enrolments from Semester 2 due to uncertainty.
- 15. Board of new entity. TEC confirmed that members will be Ministerially appointed to make sure that the right voices are around the table.
